Take U.S. Route 611 North (Broad St.) to U.S. Route 202 South. Follow U.S. 202 South 1/2 mile to College entrance on left. Or, take U.S. Route 309 North to Route 202 North, Follow U.S. Route 202 North 8 miles to College entrance on right.

From Harrisburg, PA & West

Take the PA Turnpike East to the Willow Grove Exit 343. Proceed North on U.S. Route 611 to the Chalfont Exit for U.S. Route 202 South. Follow U.S. 202 South 1/2 mile to the College entrance on left.

From the Allentown, Bethlehem area & points North

Take the Northeast extension of the PA Turnpike South to the Quakertown Exit. Proceed East on Route 313 in Quakertown. Follow Route 313 to 611 South to the 202 South exit and turn left at light. College entrance is 3/10 of a mile on the left.
